OUR VISION AND LOGO

"Stir into Flame the Gift of God" Il Timothy 1:6

Take the gift of God in your life and use it as you show Christ's love to each other. This command is taken from Paul's letter to Timothy, the namesake of our parish. In adopting it as our vision, we connect ourselves to St. Timothy as we call upon the Holy Spirit to guide us toward greater communion with God and with each other.

Our logo expresses this command. It shows individuals nourished by the Eucharist, guided by the Spirit, joined to form a community in Christ. Specifically, the logo encompasses four figures that stand for the four pillars of parish life – worship, service, faith formation, and community gathering. Their outstretched hands, joined together as a sign of unity, connect in the shape of a table to symbolize our gathering around the Table of the Lord. Between the hands, flames signify the inspiration and unity sparked by the Holy Spirit. They also symbolize the unique gifts God gives each of us, gifts we offer to our community to make it complete. To become community and be Christ to others, we first must come to be fed by Him. The Eucharist, then, is represented as the community's life-giving source. It encircles the Cross of Jesus, symbolizing Christ's sacrifice – the very center of the community from which all else springs.

Our four pillars; **Worship**, **Service**, **Faith Formation**, and **Community Gathering**, bring us together in our ministries. Our ministries would not be possible without the dedication of our parishioners. Please prayerfully discern your calling to live out your baptismal vows through one or more of our ministries.

PASTORAL PLANNING & STEWARDSHIP

Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council is the consulting body to the pastor and dialogues with and makes recommendations to the pastor for all major pastoral decisions. Council members should be active members of the parish who are good at listening to others and work cooperatively. New members are selected each year during the discernment process and serve three-year terms. The council consists of priests, school principal, 3 discerned members, and a representative from the other major councils.

Parish Tithe

Each month 5% of the total monthly offertory collection is tithed to support our Outreach efforts in the following ways:

- St. Timothy Needs Based School Scholarship and St. Vincent de Paul each receive \$500 / month.
- Grant months: up to \$3,000 of the remaining 5% funds the grant.
 Any amount over \$3,000 is divided to support our annual mission week and our outreach assistance fund
- Diocesan collection months: the remaining 5% supports the collection. There is not a second collection at Mass. Donations may also be sent directly to the diocese.

PARISH HISTORY

The time had come for a new parish. Boone County was growing, as was St. Paul Parish in Florence. In 1988, at the request of Bishop William Hughes, St. Paul's Formation Committee considered the need for a new parish. It recommended to the Diocese of Covington that one be formed and that it be located on what was then called Resurrection Cemetery property at U.S. 42 and Frogtown Road. In January of 1989, Bishop Hughes turned that recommendation into reality, announcing a new parish for the Union area.

Most of the founders would come from St. Paul Parish, and so the members-to-be chose to name the new parish St. Timothy after St. Paul's close companion. For the next several months, the parishioners celebrated Saturday evening Mass at the Union Presbyterian Church and at Camp Ernst. We first celebrated Mass on Holy Thursday in 1990 in the parish center, our first building. With continued growth in spirit and numbers, we broke ground on our current church building in June 1997 and opened our doors in September 1998. The rectory was built in 2001. The parish center was renovated and expanded in 2004. To meet the needs of our families, a preschool opened in 2008 and a kindergarten opened in 2009. Growth in the area and parish has continued over the years. Over 1900 families are now registered at our parish.

Through much discernment and fundraising, the parish embraced the decision to start a parish school. In 2016 ground was broken for a new school building. It was completed in time for the 2017-18 school year and opened with 100 students in grades K-8. Our school continued to grow exponentially. With our new school additions, including a Gym, our 2023-2024 school year began with over 370 students enrolled. The Mobil classrooms are now being used for library and other special areas.

PARISH CAMPUS

Church

The church building is the cornerstone of our parish life and is located in the center of the parish grounds. The sanctuary, nave, reconciliation room, and sacristies are on the upper level. Upon entering the church building, there is a large area called the gathering space. In 2021, with the evident need to replace the carpeting, lighting, and ceiling tiles, the worship space was renovated with the sanctuary rebuilt and the reredos added.

Brodnick Hall

The lower level of the church building was named after the parish's first pastor. It contains a large hall and kitchen area that is host to numerous functions. Hall rental information can be obtained from the parish office and website. It is also home to the youth room, and a large classroom or meeting room (referred to as BH1).

Parish Center

The building is located near the church and is home to the parish offices and preschool classrooms.

Rectory

The home to our priest(s) is situated at the north end of the parish grounds. The Father Ruschman Garden is located near the rectory.

Sacrament of the Sick

Please call the parish office (859-384-1100) if you or someone in your family is to undergo surgery or if someone is in need of this sacrament.

Baptism

Families must be active registered parishioners for three months prior to having a child baptized. The Baptismal preparation program is for all new parents; both parents are required to attend. The sessions are held six times each year at 7pm. After completing the session, parents may schedule their child's baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month at 1pm and on the second weekends of the month at any Mass. Please call to schedule the class and baptism.

Confirmation

The Confirmation program for youth is a two-year program offered through PSR. Students usually receive the sacrament in eighth grade, if all requirements are met. Please refer to the Formation section for more details.

Matrimony

Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance to begin the required pre-nuptial preparation. No date should be set before contacting the parish office. Wedding policies are available from the parish office and on the parish website.

Bereavement Committee

When there is a death in a family, the parish is able to offer support in several ways. Guidance will be provided to the families in the planning of funeral liturgies and receptions at the parish. Bereavement Committee members are present to assist as needed at the funeral. To schedule a funeral contact the parish office.

Anyone who is a good listener with a caring and sympathetic heart is welcome to join the bereavement ministry. Availability during the day is helpful but not required.

Mass Intentions

The publication and designation of a certain Mass as one that is being offered for a particular person reminds everyone in the parish to pray for the person and is often the occasion for the family to gather at the designated Mass. Requests may be made in memory of a departed person, healing from physical or psychological illness, discern a vocation, or other special intention. Mass Intentions are available by contacting the parish office. The stipend for a Mass intention is \$10. Cards are available for the requestor to send to the family.

Prayer Intentions

Prayer requests may be written in the parish Book of Intentions in the Gathering Space. Please contact the parish office to have any intention published in the weekly bulletin and/or sent to the Email Prayer Team. If a request can be removed from the bulletin listing, please contact the office. Parishioners are also encouraged to join the Email Prayer Team.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Come spend some time with the Lord in private prayer on Tuesdays when our Blessed Lord is exposed in the monstrance on the altar. Religious books, devotional items, and rosaries are available to borrow. Adorers are needed for the entire day since the Blessed Sacrament must never be alone during this time. The signup sheet is in the back of church during Adoration. You can sign up for an hour each week, be a substitute, or visit as your schedule permits. If you are unable to attend for your committed time, please find a substitute.

Liturgical Ministers

Quarterly schedules are distributed to all active liturgical ministers listed below and are posted on the parish website. Weekly assignments are listed in the church bulletin. Sign-up for Holyday and Holiday Masses will be in the sacristy one to two weeks prior to the day. If you are unable to serve on your assigned day, please find a substitute.

Mass Assistants

Mass assistants prepare the church and altar for the liturgy. Open to anyone who has been confirmed. Parish training for this ministry will be provided.

Sunday Greeters

Greeters welcome parishioners and visitors in the Gathering Space offering them Sunday bulletins as they arrive for Mass. They also distribute baskets for the collection and carry the gifts to the altar. Families are encouraged to join this ministry.

Ushers

Ushers welcome, seat and assist others so that their experience during Mass is as prayerful as possible. Open to anyone in high school or older.

Servers

Servers assists the priest and deacon before, during, and after Mass. Training is required and provided at server training sessions. Fourth grade or older serve at Sunday Masses. Adults serve on weekdays.

Lectors

Lectors proclaim the Scripture readings at Mass. Must be in good standing with the Church. Parish training for this ministry will be provided.

Music Ministry

The music ministry offers a variety of ways to involve parishioners in music that enhances the worship experiences of our parish.

Parish Choir

Sings at 9:30am Sunday Mass and other special liturgies.

Rehearsals: Thursdays at 6:30pm in church. Open to anyone high school age or older. No audition required. Ability to read music is helpful but not required.

11:30am Ensemble

Provides music for 11:30am Sunday Mass.

Rehearsals: Sundays at 11am in church, other rehearsals scheduled as needed. Open to vocalists and instrumentalists.

Saturday Ensemble

Provides music for 4:30pm Saturday Mass.

Rehearsals: Saturdays at 4pm in church. Open to vocalists and instrumentalists.

Worship and Adult Faith Committee

This committee oversees all that is involved with our liturgical services and the opportunities we present for adults to grow in their faith. The committee includes ex-officio a member each of the Bereavement Committee, Music Ministry, and Art & Environment Committee. One of their main responsibilities is to assure special liturgies go smoothly, especially the Triduum. They also oversee and participate in a variety of Adult formation events from missions, to individual speakers, and other programs. They organize and do all that is necessary to promote and enable these programs to go smoothly. Through the various means of communication in the parish, they not only advertise parish programs but also those of the diocese and beyond.

This committee consists of six members besides the ex-officio members. Two members are discerned each year for three year terms. Each member can serve no more than two consecutive terms.

Outreach Ministry Committee

This committee works toward fulfilling the social teachings of the Catholic Church by promoting healing, restoring hope and affirming human potential. We do this by effectively addressing those in need within our own parish and the greater community to the best of our abilities. We also provide support to many other organizations that aid and comfort those in need.

The committee:

- Addresses outreach concerns and needs within our own parish and its boundaries.
- Discusses, develops, plans, and leads outreach activities/events and programs to address and support the needs in our local, national, and international communities, so as to promote outreach awareness and to provide parishioners with engaging opportunities in ministering to the hungry and homeless, the destitute and disadvantaged.
- Provides support for:
 - Seasonal outreach events: Back to School Drive, Thanksgiving Food and Coat Collection, Christmas Angel Tree Gift Drive, Food For Families, Prison Ministry Book Drive, Toiletries for Homeless, Blessing Bag Supplies.
 - Missions: Gallatin County CAC, St. Vincent de Paul, and an international mission. Our annual Mission Trip alternates between local, domestic and international programs to support people in need through home repair, painting, roofing, landscaping, help with food pantries, etc.
 - Outreach projects with our PSR program, school, and other parish ministries.
 - Grant program: educate our parishioners on our area's nonprofit agencies growing needs while developing outreach activities to connect parishioners' time and talent with each grant recipient.

Outreach is a discerned committee of 9 parishioners serving a 3-year term and one youth representative who serves a 1-year term. Meetings are the second Thursday of each month at 6:30pm.

Outreach Collections

Food Pantry

Sponsored by St. Vincent de Paul and serving SVDP and parishioners in need. The second weekend of every month is dedicated to collecting food items, although the bin will be available in the Gathering Space at all times for donations.

- Food For Families

Sponsored by the St. Timothy chapter of the Knights of Columbus. Parishioners are asked to contribute food, personal hygiene or cleaning supplies. Those items are then shared with a variety of agencies to help the less fortunate in our community.

- Back to School Drive

School supplies are collected during one weekend in July to benefit Northern KY local needy children through Be Concerned Backpack program.

- Thanksgiving Collection

Food, personal hygiene products, winter coats, hats, and gloves are collected during two weekends in November to be distributed to our SVdP and Gallatin County clients.

Coat Collection

Knights of Columbus collect new and gently used coats to give to support our adopted families and other clients of SVdP.

Christmas Gift Collection

Gift Giving Tree provides parishioners with Christmas gift requests for our "adopted" Christmas families through our Gallatin Co. rural mission, within the parish, and our local community.

Travel Toiletries

Parishioners donate hotel toiletries: soap, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, etc. to be given to agencies serving the homeless.

Christmas Giving Fair

Our PSR Confirmation students support nonprofit agencies by providing a short list of shopping items that can be purchased to benefit those whom they serve. Our students attend a Mission Monday at the agency of their choice to spend a few hours of their time to provide service to the agency. Each student then collects donations to be given to each agency. The students create a display to share with parishioners what they learned and what service they provided. The donations are delivered to the agencies in time for Christmas.

Missions

- Gallatin County Community Action Commission (CAC)

Our rural outreach mission is located in Gallatin County. Parishioners' donations help share God's love at Christmas with gifts for the children.

- International Mission

Project Sheluka is committed to improving the lives of people in 80 villages in the Republic of Zambia by providing them access to clean, reliable water for cooking and drinking. The proceeds of the Yard Sale will provide funding for this project.

Longest Yard Sale

Provide space for vendors to sell their wares, parking for shoppers. We also provide a booth manned by our Young In Spirit Senior members selling donated items. All the proceeds from the sale, space rental and parking and food fees raised are given to our international mission to support building schools, wells, and community kitchens.

St. Vincent de Paul

Inspired by prayer and Gospel values, the Society of St Vincent de Paul is a Catholic lay organization, organized by parish, to encourage women, men and youth to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to the needy and suffering, witnessing God's love by embracing all works of charity and justice. Vincentians partner (collaborate) with other groups (people of good will) in addressing poverty and it's many causes, without distinction, seeing the face of Christ in those we serve.

- Mission Trip

Each year we provide an opportunity for adults and students over 14 to attend a mission trip at a minimal cost. We alternate between local stay at home mission and domestic short-term mission trips where people are experiencing extreme financial struggles or have experienced flooding, tornado and other weather related damage. We offer opportunities for short-term trips for students, adults and families to serve the poor and rebuild communities in need. Every few years we offer an International Mission trip.

Local Grants

Each year, St. Timothy Parish awards financial grants to six Northern Kentucky non-profit organizations. Grants are awarded for a special project or specific item(s) of need and are not awarded to supplement operational funds. In addition to the monetary grant, the parish connects with the recipient organization and the people it serves with either a one-day outreach service project at the organization's location or with involvement in an activity/outing with those served by the organization.

Grants are selected by the discerned Outreach Committee.

Fr. Ruschman Garden of Gratitude

This vegetable garden provides fresh produce to food pantries at Be Concerned, Rose Garden Center and other local nonprofit organizations that minister to the needy. Volunteers perform 100% of the garden's planting, maintenance, harvesting and delivery of its produce. Harvesting takes place early June thru early-November on Monday evenings at 6:30pm and Thursdays at 8:30am. Deliveries are made on Tuesday mornings and after harvesting on Thursdays. It is very family friendly and ideal for all ages. No experience is needed.

SACRAMENT PREPARATION

First Communion and Reconciliation

- Children who wish to receive the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Reconciliation (grade 2) and attend a public school must have completed a full year of religious education in the Catholic faith prior to the sacrament year. Students must also attend Parish Religious Education classes for the entire year of second grade. If a student has not had the pre-requisite religious education and is currently in the second grade, he or she will be enrolled in a first grade class and will receive the sacraments the following year.
- Children who are in grades 3-6 and are in need of sacraments may be required to participate in our Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC), which meets on Sunday at 10am. This is a specific program designed to prepare older students for the sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation.
- Students who are St. Timothy parishioners and attend a Catholic School or are Homeschooled will receive their sacraments at St. Timothy Parish. These students are required to register and attend the PSR sacrament preparation retreats on required dates.

Confirmation

- Children who wish to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation (grade 8) and attend a public school must have completed a full year of religious education in the Catholic faith prior to the sacrament year. Students must also attend the Parish School of Religion classes for the entire eighth grade Confirmation preparation year. If a student has not had the pre-requisite religious education and is currently in the eighth grade, he or she will be enrolled in a seventh grade class and will receive the sacrament the following year.
- Students who are homeschooled and are St. Timothy parishioners will receive the sacrament at St. Timothy. Homeschooled students in eighth grade must attend the regular Parish School of Religion classes for the entire eighth grade year to receive the sacrament.
- Students who are St. Timothy parishioners and attend a Catholic School can receive the sacrament at St. Timothy. Catholic school students in eighth grade are required to attend all Parish School of Religion classes for the eighth grade Confirmation preparation year.
- Confirmation Students will also be required to obtain service hours and attend retreats during the sacrament preparation time.

 education process. By e-mail, you will be notified to complete the monthly assignment
 by a specified deadline. The status of your online training is shown on the website.
- If the bulletin is not completed, the account will be suspended. The volunteer will have 30 days to catch up. After the 30 day period, all non-compliant accounts will be put into suspension and volunteering will not be permitted during the next three months. Reading the bulletins will alert the parish or school that you are available to volunteer during the next quarter.
