Lent Is Almost Here *By Fr. Rick Bolte*

Is that good news or bad news for you? For many, Lent may seem like a season of deprivation—a time to give up something enjoyable or take on an extra burden. It can be hard to see that as something positive. Some might welcome it as an opportunity for self-discipline, giving up sweets or curbing bad habits like excessive screen time. While those are admirable goals, Lent calls us to something deeper.

Lent is a time of preparation, a sacred journey leading us to the celebration of the Paschal Mystery—the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Through these forty days, we are invited to walk with Christ in his suffering so that we may also experience the joy of his resurrection. Jesus himself said, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). Our human nature resists suffering; we instinctively seek comfort and avoid hardship. Yet, Christ shows us that true life is found not in self-preservation but in self-giving love.

Jesus came into the world to reveal the boundless love of the Father. He showed us the depth of divine mercy, giving his life for us even while we were still sinners (Romans 5:8). Love always involves sacrifice. As we contemplate his ultimate act of love, we realize that the cross was not a defeat but a path to new life. His resurrection is our assurance that suffering and sacrifice, embraced with love, lead to transformation. "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces

much fruit" (John 12:24).

So how do we embrace Lent as a season of grace rather than mere obligation? The discipline of Lent—prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—helps purify our hearts and draw us closer to God. But the goal is not simply to "give something up." Rather, we ask, "What is holding me back from fully loving God and others? What attachments keep me from self-giving love?" True penance leads to conversion, shaping our hearts to reflect Christ's love. "Rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord, your God" (Joel 2:13).

A Lenten penance is not more meaningful because it is difficult; it is valuable when it brings us closer to God and transforms our love for others. The best sacrifices are those that lead us to lasting holiness. Lent is not about proving our strength but allowing God to strengthen us. "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

Jesus embraced the cross, seeing his suffering as a path to reveal the depth of God's love. He reached out to the outcast, healed the broken, and forgave the undeserving, showing that love is greater than life itself. This Lent, let us walk that path with him. May our sacrifices unite us with Christ so that, as we arrive at Easter, we may truly rejoice in the fullness of the resurrected life. "Weeping may endure for a night, but joy comes in the morning" (Psalm 30:5).

View from the Pew

The renovation of our church back in 2021 not only incorporated so much color into our worship space and a new altar, it also brought in a 'new life' to every inch and item it touched. From the tabernacle to the chalices we serve with, the vestments to the sound system—all new.

After years of planning, budgeting, designing, fundraising and re-budgeting, we were there, but ONLY with the help of numerous generous parishioners who spent countless hours to bring our dream literally to life.

Have you ever noticed the stars on the tapestries that are surrounding

the tabernacle and include the crucifix? They represent a truly special place in our religion—the Mandorla. Ever heard of it?!

Imagine this—two huge circles, one representing Heaven (St. Timothy side of the altar) and one representing Earth (St. Paul side of the altar), and you slide them partially over each other they would create an almond shaped area in the middle called the Mandorla (where our tabernacle is). This area is a symbol of the intersection between the spiritual and physical worlds.

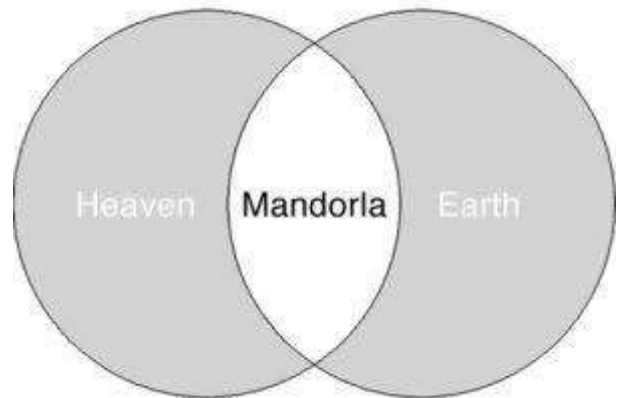
The Mandorla represents the sacred moments that transcend

time and space, such as the Resurrection and Transfiguration of Jesus.

The Mandorla expresses Christ's majesty, glory and divinity in holy icons. It is a visual way to describe that Jesus unites the earthly and heavenly realms. It creates a sacred space around Christ that can also be reserved for the Virgin Mary.

The perfect place for the king who knew he couldn't save people by riding on a horse with a sword, he knew he could only save us by dying for us. Our crucifix at the top area of the Mandorla reminds us what he did for us.

Jesus died but he didn't stay dead. We know he's no longer on that cross. He died for you, have you figured out what you're doing for him yet?

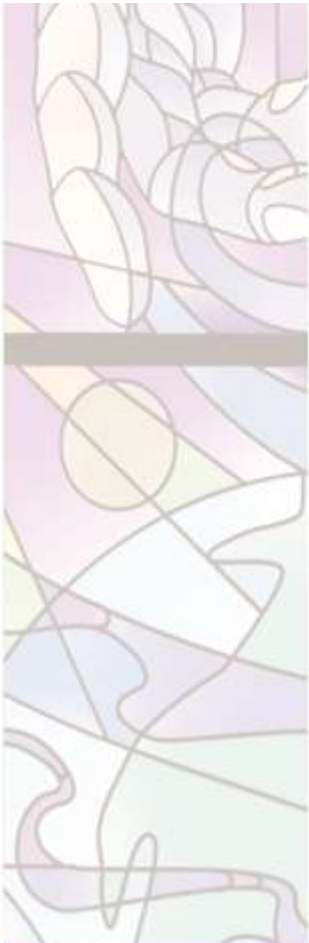

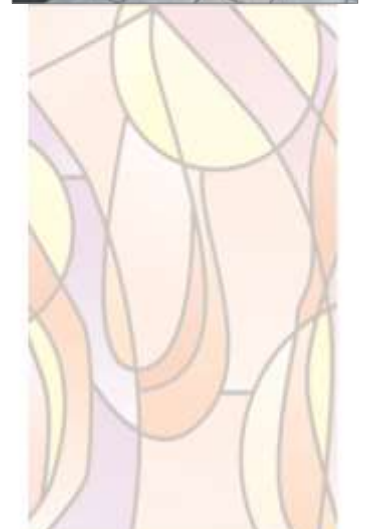

St. Timothy's focus for the day was supporting the vital work of Loaves and Fishes. This organization provides essential services to our homeless population, including clean clothing and much-needed bedrolls.

We were truly blessed to have 75 enthusiastic volunteers from all three churches join us for the afternoon. Together, we worked diligently, taping together tarps, Mylar, and blankets to create sturdy and warm bedrolls. It was incredibly moving to see the dedication and teamwork as we assembled an impressive 97 bedrolls.

These thoughtfully constructed bedrolls will provide critical protection for individuals facing harsh weather conditions. They will offer a much-needed layer of warmth and dryness, especially during single-digit temperatures or rainy weather, offering a small but significant measure of comfort and safety.

This was a perfect example of what can be accomplished when we come together in service and collaboration. It was inspiring to witness the generosity and dedication of our volunteers from all three churches. We are deeply grateful for their willingness to give their time and energy to support those in need.

We extend a sincere thank you to all who participated in the Ecumenical Community Day, both from St. Timothy and our partner churches. Your contributions made a significant impact on our community. We hope you will find joy and satisfaction in knowing that your efforts will directly benefit and uplift others during this challenging time.



“Whatever ...”

The hymn that we all sing so often says:

“Whatever you do to the least of my brothers, that you do unto me.”

It’s based on what Jesus said in Matthew 25:35-36, 40 and was written in 1965 by American priest, Fr. Willard F Jabusch (1930-2018).

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul attempts to put those words into action. We only do that with your support. Our mission is both practical and spiritual. We meet people face-to-face: Food, Utility bills, Clothing, Prayers. Many just need a little bit of help to get them over a rough patch. Others need more long-term assistance. All need someone to listen. It’s not always easy, but it’s *always* rewarding.

Your financial support and food donations to St. Tim’s Pantry are the foundation for what we do. Beyond that, as a SVDP Volunteer or Supporter you can:

- Visit with people on the phone, in their homes, or at church.
- Stock the shelves in the Church Pantry.
- Man the phones at the Call Center in Crestview Hills.
- Help to manage the recordkeeping of our Conference and Council.
- Donate money here at St Tim’s, or, contribute clothing and household goods to the stores.

Jesus says, “It is more blessed to give than to receive” (1 John 3:17).

It’s important to understand that this national and international effort primarily represents the commitment of volunteers at the *local* level.

- The Society numbers about 800,000 volunteer members in 153 countries.
- In the US, SVDP has nearly 90,000 volunteers organized into 4,428 parish Conferences under 500 diocesan Councils.
- As of 2023, the National Council reported that SVDP Volunteers contributed **12.5 million** hours of volunteer service with the total value of more than **\$1.7 billion**. These offerings helped more than **5 million!** of our neighbors.

Northern Kentucky has four SVDP thrift stores – Florence, Covington, Falmouth, and Cold Spring. They accept contributions of clothing and household items. These are offered at low prices or at no cost with vouchers that Vincentians provide.

Requests to St. Tim’s Conference have increased dramatically over the past few years due to Covid, inflation, and a limited job market. Our Conference receives crucial support from the Knights of Columbus to provide winter coats for our neighbors who often are not prepared for the cold weather. We also work with various agencies, both public and private, to assist those in need.

St. Tim’s parishioners have been incredibly generous. You have responded generously to St. Vincent de Paul:

**“Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have,
for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.” (Hebrews 13:16)**

You can be sure that your contributions are carefully managed to get the most out of each dollar.

Fr. Jabusch’s hymn concludes:

**“When I Was Happy, You Shared In My Joy.
Now Enter Into The Home Of My Father.”**

Each Council is then awarded a certain amount of monies to purchase coats based on the weighed food total. This year Al Kovacic, his wife Bonnie and their grandsons, Daniel and Thomas were able to purchase coats for 62 families consisting of 197 children and another 40 adults. They store and sort by size incoming coats, purchased coats and then bag them for distribution to the families at Thanksgiving. Welcome House

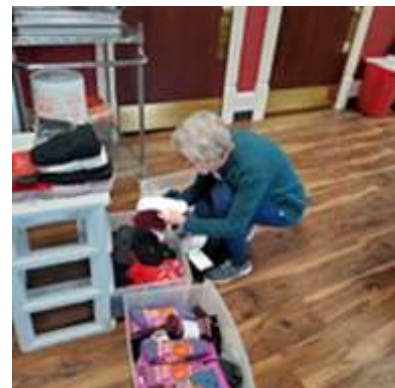

Subject: Pump at Kalenge Village School

About 14 years ago the Czech government drilled a deep (20 m, 66 ft) well and installed a deep lift pump at Kalenge Village School. Last year this pump broke. After installing several Barotse Strong Pumps (the local name for the pump I designed) our Foreman John Simasiku noticed students and teachers using the village BSP closest to the school, about 300 m (1,000 ft) away. They asked if they might have a BSP. Of course we complied. The depth to water is 5.5 m (18 ft) and John installed the pump low enough so it can be operated by even the smallest students. Attached is a photo of students with the new Kalenge Village School Barotse Strong Pump.

The weather has turned to daily rains and has ended our field season until March. We may install the occasional BSP as weather allows. We now have installed 45 BSPs and are providing water to approximately 4,000 people.

Subject: Project Sheluka Update

I hope this message finds you and your family in good health and spirits heading into the holiday season.

Our first push into the field has been a success -- not saying that everything went as planned, it never does. This autumn we (our foreman John Simasiku) installed 46 sandpoint wells and pumps. These pumps supply water to approximately 4,000 individuals. The most striking revelation was the number of villages that were missed during our July 2020 survey of the Matebele and Mulonga Plains. During this expedition we (Prof. Imasiku and John) found 80 villages with the need of 110 wells; approximately one well per 100 people. While traveling from village to village along the northeastern portion of the Matabele Plain, John found additional villages. How do you deny a well and pump to a village of 85 people just because you were unaware of their existence? Of course you cannot. We do not know how many additional "surprise" villages will be found but I think rather than the 110 of the original estimate it may take in the neighborhood of 180. This will involve more fundraising to procure the necessary materials.

I have updated the ProjectSheluka.org website to include a Google Map of our activity. Click on the "Google Map" link to view our progress. If you click on a BLUE or GREEN symbol (completed wells) you will see a photograph of the specific well during installation and the village name. The map will be updated as we install more wells. Note that the coordinates are a bit shaky. We now have a GPS receiver that will tidy up the geospatial data. I will add these data as they become available.
